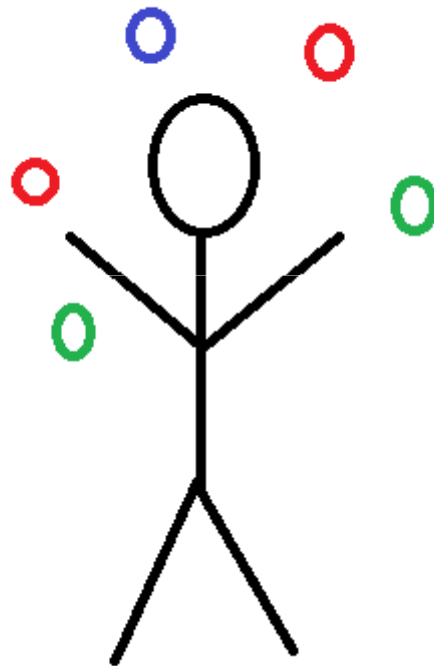

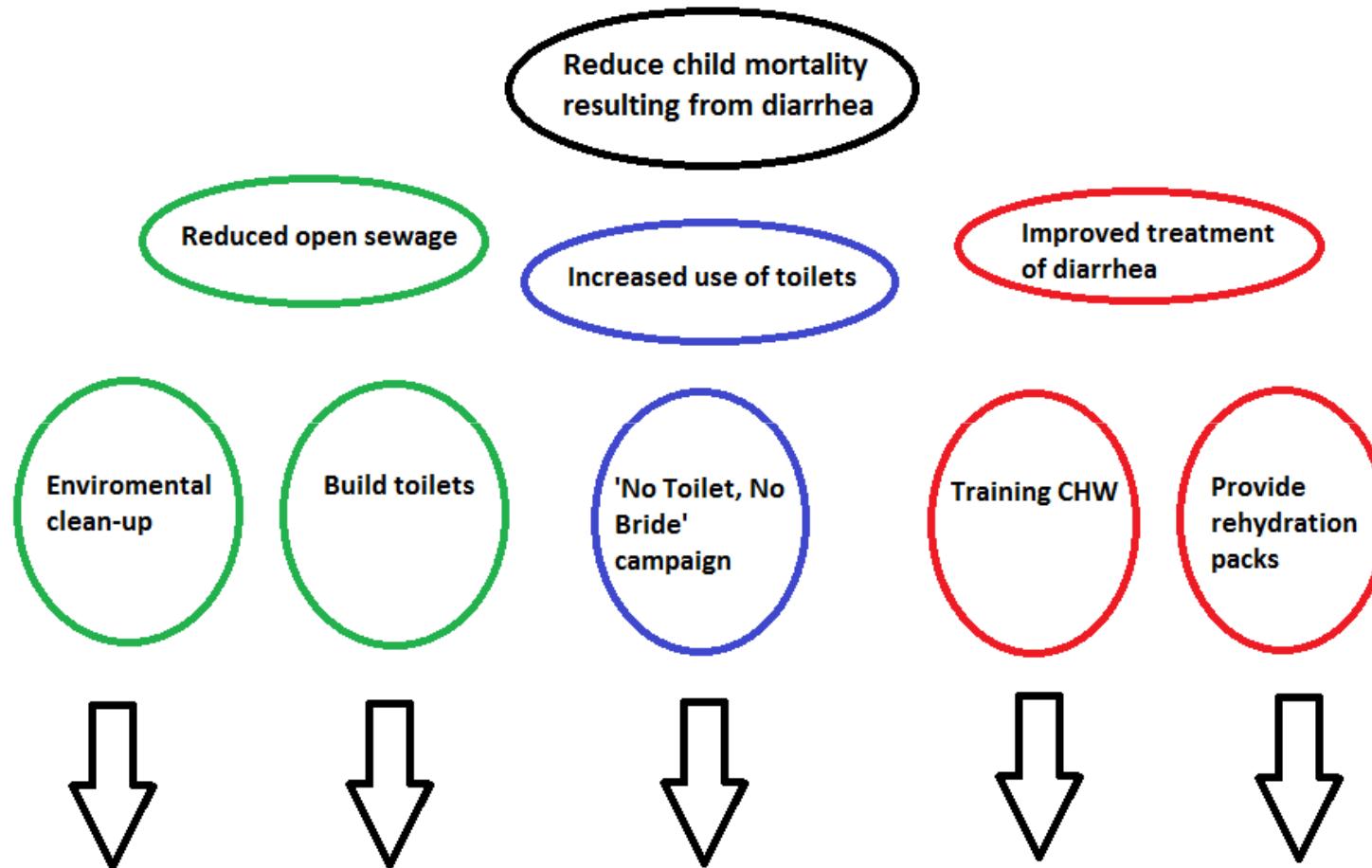

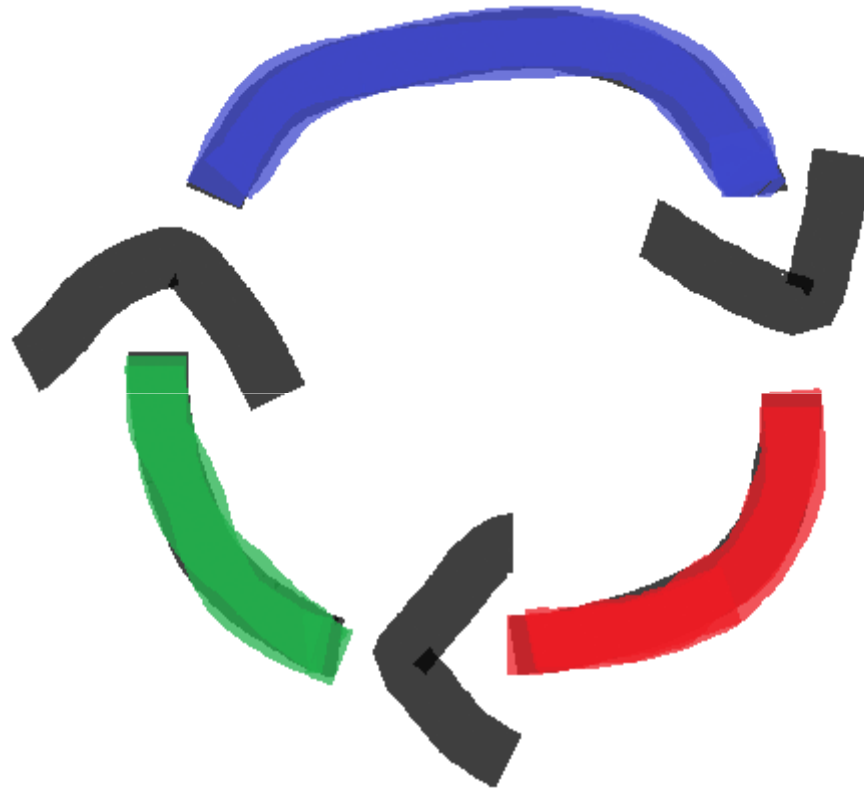


Communication

- Reporting requirements

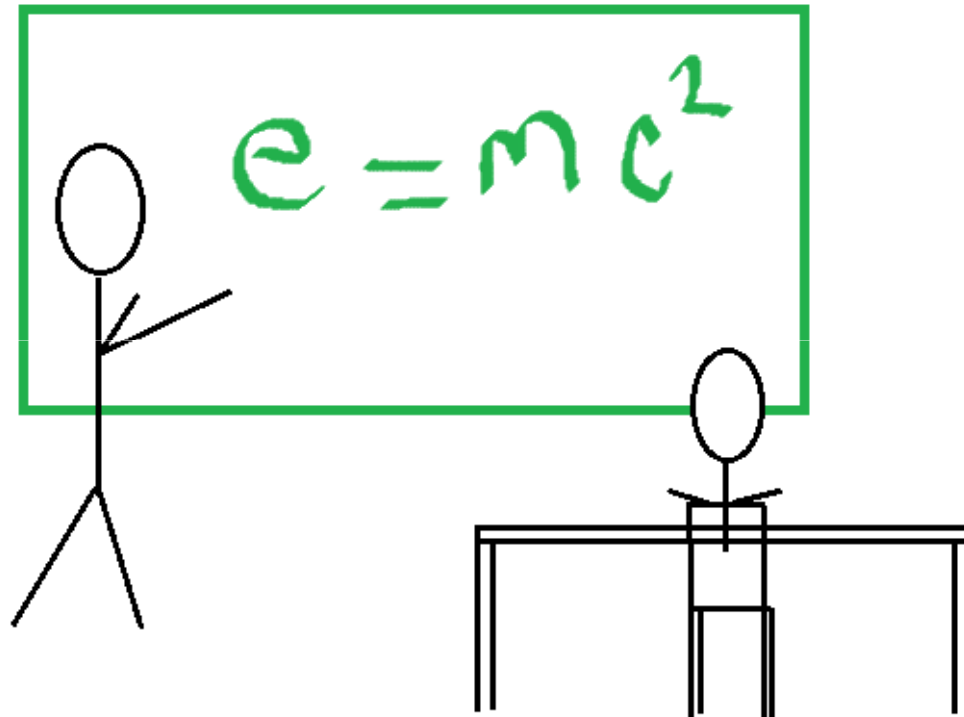
Managing funds

- Export and import taxes

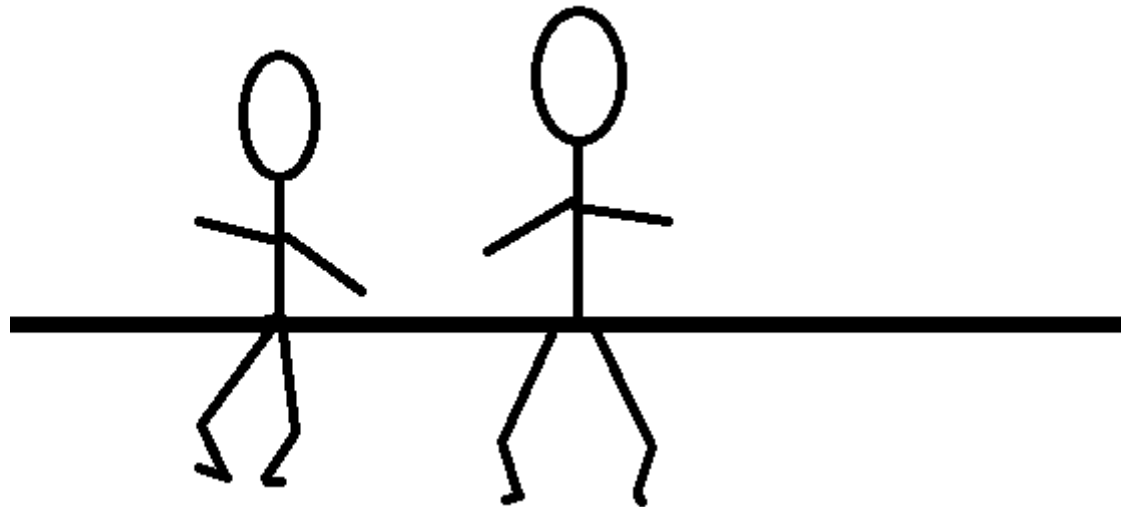
